Please note: There will be another function in the hall next door so parking may be busy but there is an overflow car park - entrance is via Stag Lane or Bacon Lane, off Princess Avenue. There is also limited but free parking spaces on streets nearby.

The Venue rules provide that we keep a register of everyone in attendance so please ensure everyone in your group are registered on arrival.


